FAY NICOLL, QUILT ARTIST, FABRIC & PATTERN DESIGNER & TEACHER



Fay Nicoll came to quilting and fabric design after several other careers, which included a stint on Broadway, recording 4 albums, and owning several other businesses (one of which was a Diet Center...but that was many M & M's ago!!!). After 40 years of sewing clothes and costumes for the stage, Fay bought an embroidery machine, and then shortly thereafter, she bought the embroidery store.

When an accident put her in a wheelchair for three months, sewing her clothes was out of the question.

But not one to be easily deterred, and needing to be in front of a sewing machine, she picked up a paper-piecing book, chose a block, made it, and a quilting fiend was born.

The embroidery store was transformed into an embroidery/quilt shop in no time, and within a few months, the shop, Sunshine Sewing in Margate, Florida, became Sunshine Sewing and Quilting, the second largest quilt shop in the state. Fay went on to teach across the state, sharing her patterns. The response was overwhelming, and her first pattern company was born.

She soon realized that there were almost no patterns with a Jewish theme. SEW...a second pattern company was created. Fay then designed her first Jewish fabric line, called Star of David, which sold out very quickly.

She has now designed six lines of Jewish-themed fabrics, and has added stationery and gift items based on her designs. Several of her original quilt designs have been published in the quilt industry's most popular magazines.
